He also worked within a mental health crisis team offering out-of-hours intervention to people experiencing acute mental health distress. As a Social Worker he has also worked in child protection and with vulnerable adults (he continues to be a Registered Social Worker). As a researcher, Andrew's interest lies in counselling and psychotherapy interventions with people who are suicidal.

Prof. Mary Creaner is an Assistant Professor and Research Co-ordinator with the Doctorate in Counselling Psychology and is the Course Director of the M.Sc./P.Grad.Dip. in Clinical Supervision, Trinity College, Dublin. Mary holds a Doctorate in Psychotherapy and is an IACP Accredited Psychotherapist and Clinical Supervisor. As a researcher, Mary is particularly interested in practitioner research and research that informs clinical practice in both therapy and supervision'.

He developed the Interpersonal-Psychological Theory of Suicidal Behaviour and is Director of the laboratory for the Study of the Psychology and Neurobiology of Mood Disorders, Suicide, and Related Conditions at Florida State University. He has written a range of

publications in relation to suicide notably “Why People Die by Suicide”, (2009) and “Myths About Suicide”, (2011).

Professor Rory O’Connor is the President Elect, International Academy of Suicide Research. He has an international reputation for conducting high quality, theoretically-grounded and innovative research into suicide and suicidal behaviour.
