Training for IACP Members in “Child Protection and the Counsellor / Psychotherapist” 2014

Over the coming months, the IACP will be providing subsidised training to IACP Members in “Child Protection and the Counsellor / Psychotherapist” at different venues across the country.

Mandatory reporting of Child Sexual Abuse is being introduced to Ireland.

This course aims to:

- Provide clear information to Counsellors / Psychotherapists working with Adult Survivors of Child Sexual Abuse regarding their legal obligations to report retrospective allegations
- Explore strategies to manage the impact on the Therapeutic Relationship.

The course is participative and experiential, and includes presentations, small group work and role plays.

Extensive hand-outs will be provided.

The training is being presented by the organisation One in Four. (Please see Course Outline and more information on One in Four below).

This is a **One Day Course**, which is repeated in each venue around the country.

The cost of this One Day Course is being subsidised by IACP, which reduces the attendance **fee for Members to only €45**
